

MEDICAL CANNABIS PATIENT FAQ'S

The following condition(s) and processes must be strictly adhered to and must be met in order for patients to qualify for and retain medical cannabis certifications:

- Conditions must be thoroughly documented and supported and be allowed/specified according to all Alabama State Laws and Regulations
 - Patients may make themselves familiar with such qualifying conditions by visiting the website of The Alabama Medical Cannabis Commission
- Visits
 - Initial consultation and certification visit (a stand alone visit, where no other issues will be discussed during this visit)
 - Consult and payment do not guarantee approval of certification; our doctors will not certify any patient they deem unqualified for treatment as dictated by the Alabama Medical Cannabis Commission and the Alabama Board of Medical Examiners
 - The office will enforce a zero tolerance policy of the patient code of conduct and compliance agreement
 - Patients are responsible for meeting all financial obligations at time of service, and should always make themselves aware of the limitations and benefits of the insurance plan they have chosen for coverage
 - This visit will not coincide with other conditions, concerns or questions for doctors
 - Patients are ultimately responsible for all insurance financial responsibilities or noncovered services
 - After consultations and in cases of approval patient will be certified within 14 days from date of service; and must pay a \$20 administrative fee for processing the completion of certification
 - Follow-up visits must be adhered to as ordered, failure for patients to follow-up as directed by the physician may see certification revoked (30 days minimum, 90 days maximum)
 - Annual renewal visit, re-certification required as it was with the same terms as the initial visit
- Approved forms of medical cannabis include
 - Tablets, capsules, tinctures, inhalers, topicals, patches and more
 - Smoking and raw plant are not permitted under Alabama law
